Middle School Updates

- When applying to Middle schools, students are choosing programs/windows within a specific school.
 Each school may have several programs to add to your application. Choose <u>up to #12</u>, true order of preference.
- **At PS 221 & in District 26 we are zoned for middle school & 95% of our students continue on to MS67.**
- **NEW for Fall 2025— More Choices—students can now apply to <u>any</u> NYC public middle school across boroughs**
- Middle Schools uses the following ADMISSIONS METHODS::
 - Zoned priorities (address).
 - Open (random selection/lottery)
 - Screened {reviews academic information in core courses from 4th Grade.} some may require auditions.
- If a school has more applicants than available seats, offers will be made using <u>priority groups and random</u> <u>selection</u>
 - (a lottery based on computer-generated # via MySchools).





Sibling Priority (full, ½ & step, siblings)

Families of multiples (twins/triplets) may submit identical applications for each child, so they receive an offer to the same program. After the 1st applicant, the system will prompt to duplicate application. ©

Priority to students and residents of the district (or borough)





Priority to applicants eligible for free and reduced lunch (FRL) for up to 50% of seats



Open House Schedule

Attention all 5th grade parents and guardians in District 26!

The Middle School application period is from October 15 to December 12, 2025. Most students in District 26 attend their zoned Middle Schools. Families also have options to apply to a school outside their zone. Screened programs admit students based on their fourth-grade report cards. Districtwide programs admit students based on a lottery. Each District 26 Middle School will provide two Open House opportunities: a virtual event to provide you with information about program offerings and the MS application process, and an in-person event for families to visit the school.

Seat Groups



- Each middle school program has a set number of seats for incoming students.
- There are specific seats for general education students (GE), and students with disabilities (SWD).
- Applicants are automatically assigned to one group of seats based on the student's instructional program.



Students with Disabilities (SWD)

Receive special education instructional programming for more than 20% of their academic program.



General Education Students (GE)

Receive special education instructional programming for 20% or less of their academic program.

How do students get middle school offers?

Everyone receives 1 match.

Students are waitlisted for choices above

their offer/or can add to waitlists.

Choices on the Application

The programs you include in your child's application AND the order in which they are placed

Seat Availability

The number of seats available for applicants

Admissions Priorities

The order in which groups of applicants are considered

How students are matched to seats



Admissions Priorities



If there are more applicants to a program than seats available, students will be considered for offers in groups based on that program's admissions priorities.


- All applicants in priority group 1 will be considered first.
- Then, if seats are still available, applicants in priority group 2 will be considered next, and so on.

A zone priority program will have a priority for zoned students. This means that all zoned applicants get offers before any non-zoned applicants. List your TOP Program as your #1 choice, then so on. Always list your Zoned school on the application.

- Example Chambers Street School has #8 available seats & #11 applicants
- Three priority groups
 - Priority Group 1: Students who live in the middle school zone
 - Priority Group 2: Students and residents of the district
 - Priority Group 3: All NYC Students and Residents

Admissions Factors: Priority Groups





As part of the admissions process, each applicant was assigned a random number.

PRIORITY GROUP 1

First, the applicants in priority group 1 are considered for offers. Since there are four of them and eight available seats, all priority 1 applicants get an offer to this program.

PRIORITY GROUP 2

Next, the applicants in priority group 2 are considered for offers. Four seats remain, and since there are only three applicants in priority group 2, all of them get offers.

PRIORITY GROUP 3

Finally, the applicants in priority group 3 are considered for offers. Only one seat is left. This means that students' randomly assigned numbers

will determine who gets that offer.

**Other admissions methods | Talent Tests: How to Apply to Mark Twain IS 239/District 21

Citywide school located in District 21 in Coney Island, Brooklyn | Offers 10 talent-area programs.

- Your child can apply and test or audition for up to 2 two talent areas that the school offers: this could be two audition programs, two talent test programs, or one of each.
- Admissions to the five visual and performing art programs, Art, Media, Strings, Winds, and Vocal, will be based on Virtual Auditions. Students will submit their audition material via "Additional Materials" in MySchools by December 12.
- The other talents, Dance, Drama, Computer Math, Creative Writing/Journalism, Science, and Athletics audition and tests will be held in person at Mark Twain. You must register to take the test and in-person audition add it to your application to be considered for the program. The deadline to register to test is November 3.
- Offers to these programs are made based on students' auditions or score on talent tests.

Offer Release and Waitlists



Offers will be available **April 15.**

- The Office of Student Enrollment will notify families and schools when offers are Available. I will also email all Grade 5 families
- Families will be <u>automatically waitlisted</u> at any programs ranked higher than the program to which the student received an offer.
 - For example, if a student gets an offer to their 2nd second choice program, they will be automatically waitlisted at their 1 choice program.
